Holy Family was established in 2000, after many years of prayerful planning by the local community. The school established special relationships with seven supporting parishes - St. Albert the Great, St. John Vianney, St. Margaret Mary, St. Mary Our Lady of the Lake, St. Thomas More, St. Vincent de Paul, and St. William. Holy Family serves over 480 students in Pre-Kindergarten through 8th grade.

Recognition	Holy Family is a Blue Ribbon School, having received the 2006 No Child Left Behind Blue Ribbon Award, given by the U.S. Department of Education. The award means that at the very least, our test scores place us in the top 10% of all the schools in the nation.		
Test Scores	Our students score well above the national average in over 60 subtests of the Iowa Test of Basic Skills (ITBS) given in grades 1-8. Remediation and enrichment is offered for students in Reading and Math that meet specific criteria.		
Facilities	Located on a beautiful 20 acre campus in northwest Austin, our expansive campus with natural landscape serves as a wonderful enhancement to our school community. The four main buildings are joined by the covered walkways, and a signature cross is present on each building as a sign of our faith.
