Holy Family serves over 580 students in Pre-Kindergarten (4-year-olds) through 8th grade.

Test Scores	Our students score well above the national average in over 60 subtests of the Iowa Assessments given in grades 1-8. Remediation and enrichment is offered for students in Reading and Math that meet specific criteria.		
Facilities	Located on a beautiful 20-acre campus in northwest Austin, our expansive campus with natural landscape serves as a wonderful enhancement to our school community. The main buildings are joined by the covered walkways, and a signature cross is present on each building as a sign of our faith.
