Pillar I: The Profession of Faith

1. Faith and Reason

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Trust God with all your heart.

Be thankful for the gift of life.

Love the beauty of God's creation.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Pray to God to help you stay with Him always.

Pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to grow in you.

Spend time playing outdoors surrounded by God's Creation.

Listen to one's parents, teachers, and catechists as they teach you about Jesus.

Be attentive in times of prayer and in Holy Mass.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Identify that everyone is called to love God.

Articulate that God exists and loves you.

Identify that it is good to know God.

Articulate that creation tells us about God.

Articulate that we can trust what God tells us.

Identify that God gives us minds to think with, the Bible, and the teachings of the Church so that we can know Him more.

2. Divine Revelation

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Be thankful that God tells us how much He loves us.

Want to know Jesus better.

Enjoy the stories from the Bible, especially about Jesus.

Enjoy looking through a children's Bible.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Listen with attention when the Bible is read.

Treat one's Bible with love and respect.

Ask questions about the Bible.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware that God has told us about Himself through nature and in the Bible.

Know that the Bible is also called Sacred Scripture.

Identify God as the author of the Bible.

Be aware that the Bible has two main sections: the Old Testament and the New Testament. Be aware that the Old Testament tells us about God's chosen people, the Israelites.

Be aware that in the Old Testament, God promised to send Jesus to save us from sin.

Be aware that the four Gospels tell us about the life and teaching of Jesus.

Know that we hear the Bible proclaimed in the Mass and in the celebration of the sacraments.

3. The Holy Trinity

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Love God with your whole heart.

Want to do and say things that make God happy.

Want to know God more.

Trust that God always hears our prayers.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Say God's name with reverence.

Make the Sign of the Cross with reverence.

Listen to stories from the Bible.

Tell God you love Him at Mass.

Learn to spend a few minutes praying before the Blessed Sacrament.

Bless oneself with holy water when entering the Church.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Identify that God made everything.

Know that there is one God.

Identify that God is the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Articulate that God is love.

Be aware that God knows everything and is all powerful.

Know that we are made God's children in Baptism.

4. Jesus Christ/Christology

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Love god with one's whole heart.

Believe that Jesus loves us.

Want to care for others as Jesus does.

Trust that Jesus never leaves us alone.

Believe that the Eucharist is Jesus.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Reverently make the Sign of the Cross.

Show curiosity and attention during the Mass.

Learn some of the stories about Jesus' life in the Bible.

Do small acts of kindness out of love for God and others.

Talk to Jesus in prayer each day.

Look at books about the saints and children's Bibles.

Genuflect with reverence before the Tabernacle where Jesus is.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware that Jesus is true God and true man.

Articulate that Jesus is our Savior.

Be aware that we are called to live like Jesus.

Articulate that we get to know Jesus through the Bible.

Be aware that Mary is the Mother of God because she is Jesus' mother, and Jesus is God the Son.

Know that the Eucharist is Jesus.

Identify the Holy Family- Jesus, Mary, and Joseph- and become familiar with narratives about the Holy Family in the Bible.

5. The Church/Ecclesiology

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Believe that the Lord is always with us.

Love the saints.

Be thankful for God's love.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Be attentive in holy Mass.

Be helpful to one's family and the parish community.

Pray for the Church.

Pray with one's family.

Celebrate the Church's liturgical seasons and feasts of the saints.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware that we can call the Catholic Church the Body of Christ.

Be aware that the Church is made up of men and women but led by God.

Be aware that the Church is a gift given to us by Christ.

Be aware that the Bishops, in union with the Pope, lead and teach the Church.

Be aware that the Church is called to worship God.

Know that the Church year has liturgical seasons and feasts.

Be aware that priests and deacons serve the Church.

Identify the saints as God's special friends who are part of the family of the Church in heaven.

Identify main elements of the physical Church and holy Mass, such as the altar, the gifts of bread and wine, and statues, paintings, or icons of the saints.

Be aware that Mary is the Mother of God and that she cares and prays for us.

Pillar II: The Celebration of the Christian Mystery

6. Sacramental Life

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Be curious about the mass and eager to participate, anticipating a time when one can receive Jesus.

Be grateful for the sacraments.

Be grateful for being baptized.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Participate in holy Mass.

Participate in parish prayers and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with one's family when possible.

Bless oneslf with holy water.

Genuflect with reverence to the Lord in the Tabernacle.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware of the Liturgical seasons: Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter and special feasts of Mary and the saints.

Be aware that we meet Jesus in the sacraments.

Articulate that in the sacraments, there are things people are doing that we can see, and there are things God is doing that we cannot see.

Identify Baptism as the sacrament through which we become children of God and members of the family of the Church.

Know that the Eucharist is Jesus himself.

Pillar III: Life in Christ

7. Humanity's Nature, Purpose, and End

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Love God as Father and be thankful that He has made us His children.

Love others like Jesus.

Be thankful to God for creating you and for creating a beautiful world.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Show love to God and others through kind words and helpful actions.

Obey one's parents and caregivers.

Demonstrate gratitude for your life and family.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware that God has created us to love Him and others.

Articulate that living as God has taught us makes us happy.

Know that God loves us.

Be aware that God created us with a plan for our life.

Be aware that God desires His children to be with Him in heaven one day.

8. Moral Living

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Want to become the saint that God has called you to.

Love God and others.

Want to do what Jesus teaches us each day.

Be grateful for your family and friends.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you be holy.

Say you are sorry if you hurt someone, and forgive those who have hurt you.

Share with others.

Speak with kind and respectful language.

Pray each day.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware that Jesus taught his disciples how to live a holy life.

Be aware that we should love others as God loves us.

Articulate that God forgives us when we are truly sorry.

Be aware that God gives us His laws to help us learn the difference between good choices and bad choices.

Be aware that grace helps us to be good.

Articulate that God wants each of us to love Him and live with Him forever in heaven.

Pillar IV: Prayer

9. Prayer

Interior Life Goals (Internalizing the Faith)

Love to pray.

Look forward to telling God about your day in prayer.

Enjoy learning new prayers

Be thankful that God loves you and always hears your prayers.

Behavioral Goals (Living as a Disciple of the Lord)

Be attentive during Mass.

Pray with one's family, especially traditional prayers and devotions.

Practice praying before the Blessed Sacrament for a few minutes in silence.

Join with the Church in liturgical prayers such as "Amen" and "Alleluia."

Speak to the Lord each day in prayer.

Ask the saints to pray for you and your Guardian Angel to watch over you.

Cognitive Goals (Growing in Knowledge of the Lord)

Be aware that we show God that we love Him when we pray, especially at Mass.

Know that the Holy Spirit helps us to pray.

Identify the Bible as a source of prayer.

Articulate that prayer helps us to know God.

Be familiar with prayers such as the Sign of the Cross, Grace Before Meals, the Hail Mary, and the Our Father.

Identify some of the liturgical seasons of the Church.

Know that the saints pray for us.

Understand that it is good to pray each day with one's family.
