SIXTH GRADE SAINT PROJECT

The sixth grade students have the opportunity to research a saint of their choice by reading a biography and other supporting information to make their saint 'come alive' for the student body of the school. The students research and create a costume that would have been worn by their saint, and then they try to step into the character of that saint and 'become' that saint through their words and actions as they perform a monologue to the classroom audiences. The day begins as the sixth grade students come to school dressed as their chosen saint and participate in the procession at our All Saint's Day Mass, and adopted school feast day. The 'saints' are seated around the church to illustrate how we are in the communion of saints and that they are ever present. After participating and leading Mass, the saints visit the students throughout the school so younger students have the opportunity to meet them!

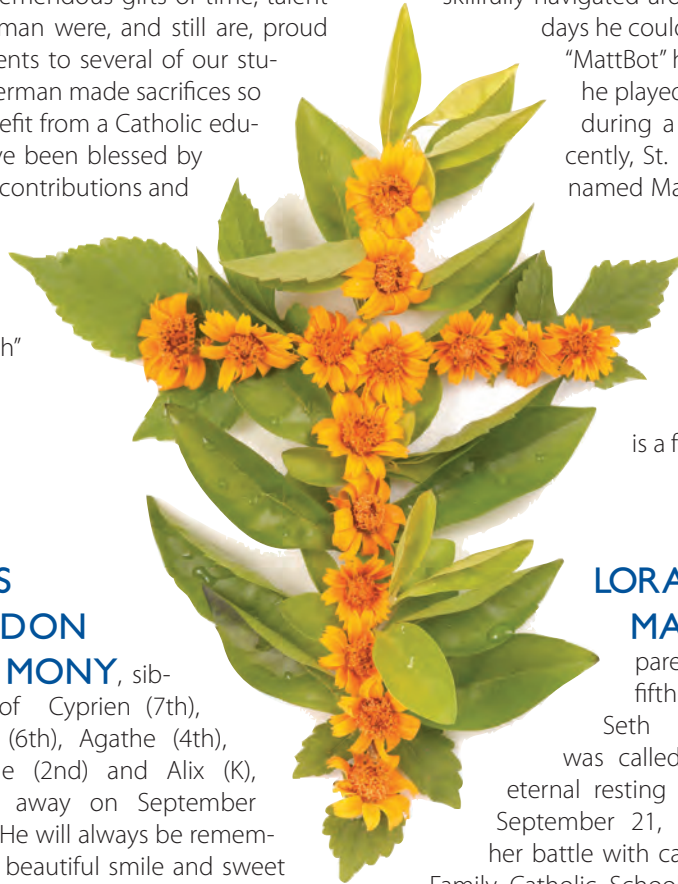
Mr. Kellerman for his kind, generous heart.

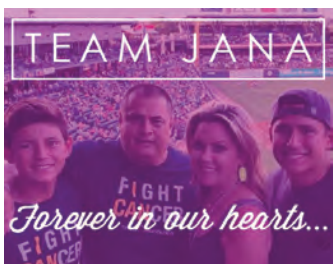
