# Students voice support for life at state-wide rally

The Texas Pro-Life Day was a day full of prolife activities. The Angels 4 Life club organized the day for our school. The Angel 4 Life members worked for months to get transportation, design shirts to wear, and share the event with the whole school to get people to come.

At 8:30 a.m., everyone met in the Holy Family parking lot to get on the bus and go to St. Louis Catholic Church for the Mass. Bishop Michael Mulvey came up from Corpus Christi to host this Mass. Along with Bishop Michael, there were the parish priests, Fr. Craig, Fr. Jose, and Fr. Saji.

After Mass, The Knights of Columbus were nice enough to volunteer to host lunch for everyone and so we ate burgers before they rode over to the rally. The rally was awesome, with thousands of people coming to support the movement.

"My favorite part of the rally was seeing all the people of our state gathered in one place to voice our shared beliefs and celebrate our success," said Allison M., eighth grader.

The rally went around downtown and ended in front of the capitol. There were booths lined on the sidewalk with pamphlets talking about abortion. They had speakers talking, and one speaker was an abortion survivor.


In the end, this day was very fun and powerful all together, and participants were glad they went.

# 8th grader wins first place in state science fair

Holy Family eighth grade student Sydney Griser won First Place at the Texas State Science and Engineering Fair in her category of Animal Sciences.

There were 20,000 regional science fair candidates and only 1200 winners advanced to the State Fair with only 21 able to place in first in their category. Because she won at the Texas State Fair, Sydney was also nominated again for the Thermo Fishers competition in Washington DC. Those results will be announced in September.

A nationwide panel of scientists, engineers and educators will select 30 Thermo Fisher JIC finalists from the Top 300. Later this fall, the finalists will convene in Washington, DC to compete for over \$100,000 in prizes, including the \$25,000 Thermo Fisher Scientific ASCEND (Aspiring Scientists Cultivating Exciting New Discoveries) Award; \$10,000 Broadcom Coding with Commitment TM Award; \$10,000 DoD STEM Talent Award; \$10,000 Lemelson Award for Invention; and \$10,000 Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Award for Health Advancement.

# Students experience nature, learn stewardship at camp

t's one of the most fun and original rites of passage at Holy Family Catholic School where fifth-grade students attend an overnight camp that focuses on God's creation known as Camp Kappe.

On February 20, this year's fifth-grade students, faculty, and chaperones boarded the bus to take the two-and-a-half-hour drive to Plantersville,

Texas, where the Archdiocese of Houston maintains a youth retreat facility on 130 acres of heavily wooded land.

Once settled in their cabins and all beds were claimed, students received a schedule of events for the next four days and three nights. Not a moment is wasted beginning with opening prayer before embarking on environmental studies of the pond. They determine if the pond water is in good condition by checking the nitrates, pH balance, and ammonia before dissecting a fish from the pond.

Farm and gardening are additional environmental topics taught, as the boys and girls learn the importance of being good stewards of our animals.

"We do get our resources from our animals, and they rely on us too," said Nathaniel Wooten, Director of the School of Environmental Education at Camp Kappe. "We also teach entomology where the students study insects and learn the importance of those insects in our ecosystems."

In 1998, Wooten was a student who attended Camp Kappe in fifth grade and says he remembers the homesickness he felt, which gives him a personal understanding of what it takes to leave home at that age and be without family.

There was plenty of time for fun too as students learned archery and canoeing, played soccer and basketball, had a bonfire, and performed skits on their last night at camp.

Before departing, they prayed the Stations of the Cross on Friday, February 23. When the bus arrived home in the late afternoon, a large group of families welcomed them back home, and the students seemed strangely a bit more independent than before they left.


