# A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL: Erin Vu

#### Dear Family & Friends,

Walking through the hallways, the walls are empty, the chairs are stacked, and the space is quiet. There are little clues of a school year left behind, but for the most part, the school is empty. As the faculty and students enjoy their well-deserved summer break, I have spent some time reflecting on the previous school year.

Our Core Values at Holy Family are Catholic Identity, Faith Formation, Academic Excellence, and Stewardship. Every day, I saw examples of our community living our four values. Some moments were private like witnessing a student comfort another child who was upset after falling, but other moments were public like celebrating the 8th-grade students who earned awards at their commencement. For me, a few of the highlights from the year include:

- **Catholic Identity:** The Enthronement to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. After praying and preparing all year, Jesus is now enthroned in our classrooms and office.
- Faith Formation: The faculty and staff retreat before school started. The day included small group discussions where faculty and staff were able to share their faith and pray for one another.
- Academic Excellence: The STEM night where the middle school students showcased their science


fair projects as well as providing hands-on science opportunities for elementary students. One of the projects even went on to the state competition!

• **Stewardship:** The family Eat N' Treat where the Parent Association hosted hundreds of adults and children for a hot dog dinner and Savio students hosted the children for games and fun.

Beyond the reflections on Core Values, we can also reflect on how the students at Holy Family compare to the national and Diocesan averages on the normreferenced assessment taken in grades 1-8. The graphs compare the spring scores from the students at Holy Family with the mean (average) in the Diocese of Austin and the Nation for each grade level that takes the test.


The Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) MAP test is the same test that all schools use in the Diocese of Austin. The Diocese of Austin moved to the MAP test for the 2021/2022 school year away from the IOWA test that was given once annually. The MAP test is taken three times per year, and families receive the scores for their individual child.


As you can see from the bar graph illustrations on the opposite page, at Holy Family, every grade level in each content area is performing above the Diocesan and National levels.



The preparations for the new school year are in full swing. I would like to welcome our two new assistant principals who are part of our redesigned leadership team. ### The Virtue of Patience: Waiting for Wisdom

This year, we have waited for the completion of the Wisdom Building with varying degrees of patience.

Over the last 18 months, the area has transformed from a pile of dirt to a building. During the building project, the "specials" teachers traveled to classrooms with carts carrying their supplies, and the students in grades five and six moved throughout the campus in order to attend their core classes.

Now, after a long period of patience, the wait is over. The Wisdom Building is complete and will be the new home to classrooms at the start of the new school year. The Wisdom Building will be the home for the core classes for the 5th and 6th-grade students. It will also be the home of an art classroom, a technology lab, and a Spanish classroom.

The completion of Wisdom also allows for other spaces to be used for their intended purposes. The Praise Building will now be the home of our two music classrooms. The classroom next to the library will now be a meeting space for students and other activities. The classroom in Charity will now be the new Learning Success Center for student support.

Finally, the play space on the back of the campus will be the home of a new playground structure, picnic tables, and an irrigated field.

## Enthronment Ceremony held to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Following a nine-month Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Holy Family Catholic School held an Enthronement Ceremony to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on May 11 beginning after Mass at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church. After Communion, Fr. Brian McMaster blessed images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Social Justice students carried baskets with blessed images for each classroom or office to display. The Enthronement Ceremony was held in the Holy Family Grace Building, where students were led in prayer by Ms. Tracy Lake, who then hung the newly blessed image in the office of the school.

Enthronement to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a world-wide apostolate begun in France in 1907 by Fr. Mateo Crawley-Boevey, SSCC, to carry on the work of spreading the Sacred Heart devotion that had begun in France under St. Margaret Mary Alocoque. He believed that in order to win souls for Christ and build a civilization of love, it must start with the evangelization of the family. The Sacred Heart of Jesus enthronement ceremony was approved by Pope St. Pius X in 1908, and since then this apostolate has enjoyed much success as people all over the world have enthroned Jesus as their Lord and King.








# **Congratulations to all of the Lectio Readers!**



# **RUN WITH THE ANGELS 2023**



Largely with the help of the Booster team's All-Star Andi and Juicebox Jen, Holy Family Catholic School built an obstacle course for the entire school to run, jump, and laugh their way around the field to raise critical funds for Holy Family Catholic School. This year, more faculty and staff participated in the course than ever, and nearly 79 percent of the students received donations from 48 states and 15 countries. The countries where donations came from are Canada, Chile, Denmark, El Salvador, Germany, Guatemala, Hong Kong, India, Lebanon, Mexico, Panama, the Philippines, Poland, Spain, and the United States. The HFCS goal of **\$70,000** raised was met, so an ice cream social was held at the school.
